

NEURO – LINGUISTIC PROGRAMMING (NLP) FOR HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

HR managers have to carry out competency mapping to identify the knowledge, skills, abilities and behavior essential to be possessed by the employees to accomplish the assign tasks. Every employee has to perform a multi-disciplinary role to run the organization successfully. They must possess multiple skills like fast and right decision-making, effective communication, successful negotiation, rapport building, mind-reading, good habits, etc. They



have to communicate at different levels and keep cordial relations with colleagues, team members, employees, clients, suppliers, authorities, etc. They have to take fast decisions, stay productive, win deals and contracts, etc. while keeping an eye on things around.

Ups and downs are an integral part of any business. HR managers have the responsibility to take the business to a great height, bring growth and glory, etc. to the organization in good times.

Research indicates that to achieve success you need 70% psychology and 30% business strategies, systems, process, procedures, etc.

Neuro-Linguistic Programming (NLP) can help HR managers to take care of the well-being of their employees. NLP can help managers and employees to create smooth and streamlined flow in all domains of their professional and personal life i.e. business, career, wealth creation, emotional and mental wellness, physical wellness, and amazing relations by using the power of the limitless mind. NLP experts can help you to rearrange your neuron patterns to install new desired patterns or delete undesired patterns.

Let's briefly discuss the applications and benefits of some of the NLP techniques to the organization and employees as well. NLP helps to install new good habits and delete bad habits. It will enhance focus, discipline, and productivity. Anchoring techniques can be used to enhance performance instantly by firing a trigger or stimulus. Rapport building technique and rapid mind reading technique will help you to win negotiations and enhance profits. The belief disintegrator technique can be used to destroy non-supportive (limiting) beliefs in the mind hindering progress and growth. Use the belief creator technique to install new supportive (positive) beliefs about your business and yourself. The self-esteem enhancer, the self-esteem booster, and reframing techniques can be used to put employees' selfesteem to the perfect levels. Bad memories associated with negative events can be erased to gain self-confidence again.

More than 33 basic and advanced NLP techniques are available to reprogram or program the subconscious mind and resolve 9 categories of problems. This in turn put employees on auto-pilot mode to achieve desired results for the organization and themselves.

Case Study (1): An IT Consultancy delivering On Line Analytical Processing, (OLAP) solutions integrate NLP with change management methodology. The business results were immediate high value and everything he had hoped for. They included: The success rate on OLAP projects increased to 100%. The implementation time on projects dropped to between 3 and 4, months. The business growth rate and profit percentage doubled. It also started a new division of the business, providing services, to model experts. The MD measured the year one return on his investment at over 3,000%, and the payback period as less than one month.






